#### Q&A with Porter Barron, Jr., Co-Owner, Pit Master:

After several months of takeout and reservation-only seating, The War Mouth has returned to "first come, first served" for its regular dinner hours, 5 - 10 pm, Tuesday through Saturday. Bar seating remains closed to allow for 6 feet of separation between parties, but the drinks are flowing and the new fall menu is out. Both indoor and outdoor seating are available. "We feel somewhat fortunate to have this large garage door that we can open for freshair. We've ensured a steady flow by installing a large exhaust fan above the rear exit that theoretically could suck airborne infectious particulate up and out of the dining room. Of course, there's no fully protecting yourself from the coronavirus when dining out, but we're doing what we can to reduce risk," Barron said. So it could get chilly on some evenings. If a cold night dissuades you from dining at The War Mouth, Barron urges Earlewood residents to please remember takeout and delivery.
